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Page 3 PROCEEDINGS 1 CHAIRMAN BARNES: It is Friday, April 13th, 2018. 2 I am Representative Jay Barnes, Chairman of the House 3 4 Special Investigative Committee on Oversight. Pursuant to a subpoena issued this morning by 5 Speaker Todd Richardson, the Committee is in possession of 6 a video-recorded interview of the woman identified as 7 Witness 1 in previous materials. 8 It is noted by the Governor's defense team that 9 they claim that this video contains exonerating evidence, 10 and that there is no testimony of coercion. 11 The first eleven minutes of the video are 12 inaudible. What follows is the transcription of the 13 14 interview. QUESTIONS BY INTERVIEWER AND ANSWERS BY WITNESS 1: 15 -- was trying to ask him -- I said I was 16 Α. referring to my friend which essentially was me. 17 18 My friend wants to know -- she was in this situation. She wants to know what happened or why that 19 would happen, because she knows how her situation is with 20 her husband, but she's curious --21 Basically I was just trying to ask him what 22 23 happened, did he have feelings for me? And I was really just curious, because it just happened to be weird 24 25 timing.

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Page 4 So anyways, he said he had a plan. Could I meet 1 him in a few minutes? Because I was in the Central West 2 End with my friends after work. 3 So at this point I didn't know where he lived. Ι 4 knew he lived near **Explanation**, so he said he would meet 5 me -- it was like in an alley right by Starbucks. 6 So I met him there. He just kind of hugged me 7 and, you know, was trying to calm my nerves and just said, 8 listen, I know I want to talk to you too about this. Can 9 10 you come to my house next week? And I said no. Can't we just meet at like a 11 12 Starbucks or something? He said, no, I can't be seen in public with you. 13 At this point I knew he was running for office 14 because he had told me at his appointment, because that was 15 March. 16 So then I told him I didn't know if I would be 17 able to meet him, but I would call him the night before and 18 let him know. He had asked me to come over Saturday the 19 20 following week. So then during that week -- and I -- so let me 21 22 backtrack. I had saved his number under my friend's name, 23 who is also -- she has a DC number, because his number came 24 up as DC. And I knew my husband is going to see this and 25

2	exactly what he did without me knowing until I want to

So he -- he said -- and I said, but I would be 9 Α. willing to meet you for coffee though. I'll meet you at 10 Coffee Cartel or Starbucks or somewhere. 11 And he said, no. I really cannot be seen in 12 public with you. And, you know, if you come to my house, 13 it will be fine. We can just talk. Nobody is going to see 14 you. It will be fine. Just come in my back door and 15 16 just --I guess he calmed me enough about it that I felt 17 18 like, okay, I can go -- I was going over before work, so this is seven a.m. the next morning. 19 March 20th, 21st seven a.m.? 20 Ο. 21 Α. Yes. 22 Q. And I had to be at work at eight a.m. So I was, like, okay, he knows what I 23 Α. Uh-huh. want, whatever. So that morning I went over there and he 24 was waiting in the kitchen. He had told me to come in the 25

3	keys in my hand, and he took it from me. He whenever I

14	down everywhere to see if I was wired-tapped.
15	Q. To see if you were wearing a wire?
16	A. Uh-huh.
17	Q. Okay.
18	A. And so then finally he stopped and just said,
19	look, I'm just trying to make sure that you know, I know
20	you said your your husband oh, because I had told him
21	whenever we met in the Central West End that day, you have
22	to understand my my husband is really controlling. You
23	know, he he looks through everything. He's going to see
24	that I had talked to you.
25	So anyways, he he just said, look, I just want

to make sure that he didn't put anything on you. 1 2 0. Uh-huh. Okay. So -- so then I tried talking to him, 3 Α. which was the point of me being there, and he was kind of 4 on a mission, or so it seemed. 5 And he said -- like didn't -- wasn't really 6 wanting to talk and just said, Witness 1, how long do you 7 have? When -- when do you have to be at work? 8 I told him I had to leave by, like, 7:40. 9 And he said, well, can you come back later? 10 And I told him that I got off work around four, 11 but that I couldn't because I had to get home to my kids. 12 So he was, like, well, okay. I want you --13 Witness 1, I just want you to know -- I just want you to 14 I just want to make -- I just want to take care feel good. 15 of you. And I had this idea, so I just want you to trust 16 me. And remember, I just want you to feel good and 17 18 whatever. And I was like, what are you talking about? 19 I wanna -- I want to talk to you. I want to talk 20 to you, and he said no. 21 22 Listen, have you worked out today? 23 And I said no. And he was, like, okay, I promise you this will 24 be so great, whatever. Just take these clothes and go put 25

And he said, I 2 Α. want to teach you how to do a proper pull-up. 3 And I could tell he had something sexual in mind, 4 but I felt like, oh, I had already told him I'm not 5 cheating on my husband, so whatever he has in mind, 6 he'll -- he'll respect my boundaries and whatever. 7 So up until this point he was a perfect guy to 8 9 me, so . . . Anyways, he tells me, put my hands up on the 10 rings and starts putting this, like, gauze stuff, like 11 sports tape, around my hands to keep them to the rings. 12 Uh-huh. 13 Q. But it wasn't actual tape, so I wasn't --14 Α. It was like gauze tape? 15 Q. And then he says, I'm going to put a 16 Α. Yeah. 17 blindfold on you. 18 He puts the blindfold on me. And at this point there's, like, really no 19 talking. I really was standing there, like, I have no clue 20 what the hell is going on. I'm probably just as much 21 turned on as I am fearful as I am curious. You know, I 22 don't even know. We hadn't kissed or anything. 23 So you were fearful and you were also --24 Q. I was turned on. I was --25 Α.

Ι 19 20 just kind of, like, let it dribble out thinking, oh, my God. I have no clue what's going on now. 21 22 And then he started kissing my -- kind of down my 23 neck and down my chest. And then once he got to, like, right here on my chest, he took the shirt and ripped it in 24 25 half, and then proceeded to kiss down my stomach.

Page 12 And then got to the pants and pulled down my 1 pants, and then I was just standing there motionless like, 2 oh, my God. I have no clue what's going on. 3 And then --4 You're still blindfolded? 5 Ο. I'm still blindfolded. 6 Α. 7 Okay. 0. Yeah. -- what you just told me. I mean, I have to get 18 0. it down pat. I don't want to paraphrase it. He said --19 If you ever mention my name to anyone, I'm going 20 Α. to take this picture and put it everywhere I can so 21 everyone will know what a little whore you are. 22 Take this picture and put it -- so that everyone 23 Ο. will note (sic) --24 Will know what a little whore you are. 25 Α.

And at this point just really coaxing me like a wounded little animal on the ground, I don't know, is how I felt. And I just kept saying, I'm not ready for this. And at this point he proceeds to undo his pants and take his -- take himself out of his underwear or whatever. He took his penis out of his underwear? 0. Yeah. Α. Q. Okav. And, like, put it near my face and I gave him a Α. blow job at this point. To finish, as far as I remember, the whole time -- at this point I hate him in my mind. I think he's I hate him. I can't believe I'm down here. disqusting. Q. You felt disgusted? I just felt super degraded, really disgusting. Α. Okay. You felt super betrayed? Q. I just couldn't believe that he was still turned Α.

And as soon as I got to work, I realized I 3 freaking left my keys there, because I had set them -- or 4 he had set them separately on the countertop. 5 So you walked to work --6 Ο. 7 Α. Yeah. -- from there? Ο. 8 It was like a block away. 9 Α. Okay. 10 Q. He lived really close. 11 A. And then after work -- so all day long I just 12 kept hoping he's going to bring my keys up here. Because 13 he had told me, you can never call me, after I had called 14 him, you know, from my work, and then we talked a couple of 15 16 times. So I just sat there all day thinking he's going 17 to bring up my keys, something, then realized I had to go 18 back there to get my keys because I couldn't leave. 19 So I just walked back there and went to the back 20 door, and he was waiting in the kitchen. Like I said, he 21 knew when I was getting off work that day. 22 23 0. When was this? That was the same day. 24 Α. 25 Q. Same day --

1 A. Yeah.

2 Q. -- when you went back over to his house?

3 A. To get my keys at this point.

4 Q. After work?

A. After work. It was like four p.m., and he was waiting in the kitchen. And he was back to the normal person who I had met, you know, and seen for so long where he was just kind and -- as soon as I walked in, I was just like, I am so pissed off. I am so pissed off at you.

10And he was like, I know. I know. I've been11thinking about you all day, and, you know.

12And I said, you freaking took a picture of me.13I haven't even let my husband take pictures of me.

And he said, I know, but it was just to protect myself, Witness 1. You know, I'm running for governor, and you have no clue what people would do and -- so I was just protecting myself, and I deleted the picture.

18 So to which, of course, I did not believe him 19 that he deleted the picture, because he freaking took it 20 like that, but --

But I also believed that he was sorry. I believed all of those things enough to where, you know, I left that day not as mad at him, but left that day with the understanding that we would not see each other again, like that, but that he still wanted to come in and get his hair

I told her, 3 you know, come over to my house instead. I need to talk to 4 5 you. What was her name? 6 Ο. 7 Α. 8 Ο. That's 9 No. Α. 10 Q. was the one you told about it? Yeah. 11 Α. 12 Q. Okay. are the ones that I 13 Α. told about him, like, rubbing my leg up to my crotch that 14 day or whatever. 15 You told both of them about that as well? 16 Ο. 17 Α. Uh-huh. 18 Q. Okay. So -- but **Control** is the one who came over that 19 Α. night, and I just, like, bawled my eyes out. I told her 20 all of it. 21 And, of course, she was, like, Witness 1, there's 22 no way he hasn't done this before. 23 Stop. 24 You know, I think in her mind she was just so angry at what had happened to me, but I was trying to -- I 25

1	still had feelings for him.
2	And I was so confused at this point and felt just
3	disgusted at the whole thing and didn't really know how to
4	feel about it.
5	But anyways, I told her, I think I need to tell
6	my husband, because I was I just felt so guilty and
7	disgusting and whatever. So she didn't really have an
8	opinion either way.
9	So that night she just stayed with me I think
10	that was the night she stayed with me all night long. I
11	could not sleep.
12	Then the next day I think it was the second
13	day that I told my friend, Witness 2.
14	Q. Who?
15	A. Witness 2.
16	Q. What's her full name?
17	A. Witness 2.
18	Q. (Spelling)?
19	A. (Spelling of Witness 2's name).
20	Q. (Spelling)?

22	Q. Okay. Is that (spelling)?

25	A. And then I told her I still hadn't slept and that

1 I think I need to tell my husband.

A. And she said, you know, you can't tell him because, Witness 1, he is crazy and he will do whatever he can to hurt you. And this guy sounds like he's crazy, so you -- don't -- don't do it, Witness 1. Just --

10 So I went another day. I believe it was, like, 11 three or four nights with zero sleep at this point. And I 12 just thought this -- the only way to sleep again is to tell 13 my husband. I need to tell him.

14 So I called him and said, I need to talk to you 15 about something that's really sensitive. Can we meet?

And he said, yes, we could meet. Because at this point he was still staying at his brother's. We were still separated.

So we met in the parking lot and I got into his
car.

21 Q. The parking lot of the salon?

22 A. No. It was a grocery store.

23 Q. A grocery store?

A. By our house.

25 Q. You got into his car?

1 A. Uh-huh. Yeah, because he was in the driver's 2 seat.

And I took him through everything except for the 3 very last part where I gave him oral, Eric. Because that 4 was the part that I knew, A, he's going to, you know, hate 5 me and I feel so degraded. I feel so disgusting, whatever. 6 Anyways, I eventually told him about it once we 7 were back together, but other than that, I told him pretty 8 9 much everything. Everything? 10 Q. And the other thing that I know I did not tell 11 Α. him all of was when I told him about him taking the 12 picture, I didn't say that he called me a whore, because I 13 also thought, he's going to -- I knew that my husband would 14 flip either way, but not -- you know, I was just hoping 15 16 that he would have empathy or whatever or understand. To which then that day he told me, and then the 17 following days, he really could not be with me now because 18 I was disgusting and a whore, and he needed to get an 19 20 apartment. 21 So then he got an apartment in April for, like, a three-month lease or whatever, and --22 April 2015, right? 23 Q. Uh-huh. Yes. 24 Α. 25 Q. Okay.

Page 22 So then it must have been maybe a week later, a 1 Α. week after this happened, or two weeks after I had seen 2 Eric --3 0. Uh-huh. 4 -- he came in for a haircut, and I had not spoken 5 Α. to him at all in the interim. 6 7 And when he came in, of course, he was that normal guy again. And I described to him that when I saw 8 him that first time, you know, at, like, seven a.m. -- he 9 just has this testosterone surge is what it seems like, 10 where he really does not seem like the same person. 11 You know, so the guy who was so kind and so 12 charismatic all of a sudden is just like just filled with 13 14 testosterone and rage almost, you know. So like I say, whenever I came back that day, he 15 was so -- he seemed normal again, and then when he came 16 into the salon -- other than him pretty much, each time I 17 saw him in the salon, making sure you haven't told anybody, 18 19 have you? He kept asking you that, you haven't told anyone? 20 Ο. Every single time I saw him. 21 Α. 22 Q. Okay. You haven't said anything? No. 23 Yeah. Α. So other than that, he was normal and just told 24 me, Witness 1, I can't quit thinking about you. I want to 25

Page 23 see you again. When can I see you? 1 And then as far as I remember, the next time I 2 saw him was at his next hair appointment he asked -- so --3 Ο. How -- how often did he come in for hair 4 appointments, every two weeks? 5 During this time right afterwards? 6 Α. 7 Ο. Uh-huh. Like after he came in that time? Α. 8 9 Ο. Uh-huh. He probably came in every two or three weeks. 10 Α. Okay. 11 0. Normally probably every three to four weeks. 12 Α. 13 Q. Uh-huh. But we didn't have a lot of communication 14 Α. between -- because, you know, we didn't call or text like 15 16 normal. So then the next time I saw him was for his next 17 appointment. I came in early to the salon and -- where we 18 were the only people there. I opened up the door. He came 19 in, and that time -- I did kiss him that time. I was 20 21 willing -- at this point I thought, my husband is --And this was several weeks after this incident? 22 Ο. After the first incident? 23 Α. 24 Ο. Yeah. Probably like a month later. 25 Α.

Page 24 That's when you kissed him? Month later. 1 Ο. And then I kissed him, and we basically made out, 2 Α. and then I cut his hair, then my coworker showed up, like, 3 20 minutes later or whatever. 4 Did you just kiss him? 5 0. Just kissing and, like, kind of handsy stuff, but 6 Α. 7 we were clothed, yeah. Uh-huh. 8 Ο. Yeah. So -- and that time I felt like, okay, no, 9 Α. maybe I was wrong. Maybe he is normal and that wasn't that 10 11 horrible or whatever. And then the next time was, I was sitting outside 12 of the salon on, like, the fountain outside of (13 reading a book, and he drove by and asked if -- or told me 14 to come here, he wanted to talk to me. This was in between 15 haircuts too, so . . . 16 Between haircuts you saw him? 17 0. So this would have been probably sometime 18 Α. Yeah. 19 in May. 20 May 2015, okay. 0. My guess, yeah. And he told me to come here. He 21 Α. said, you look so beautiful sitting there. I want to see 22 you. Can you come over tonight? 23 And I told him I didn't know, you know, because I 24 had to get back to my kids, but maybe I could come by 25

1 before I got my kids. And so after work that night, I went over there 2 for a short time, because I did have to leave, maybe 30 3 minutes or something, 45 minutes. 4 And that time was sexual in nature. 5 6 have intercourse, but we basically -- we were in his bathroom and just like both of us participating in a sexual 7 encounter, I guess, just without intercourse, yeah. 8 There was no sexual intercourse? 9 0. There -- yeah, no sexual intercourse. 10 Α. No. was never any sexual intercourse. 11 Just oral sex? 12 0. Just oral sex. 13 Α. And the sexual nature at that time was oral sex 14 0. as well? 15 16 Α. Right. You both participated in? 17 Q. Both. And that time --18 Α. In his bathroom? 19 0.

20 In his bathroom. Other than -- you know, like I Α. 21 said, he just kind of takes on a different persona or whatever when he's like that, kind of testosterone. He was 22 fine that time. It wasn't scary to me. 23 Uh-huh. 24 **Q**.

So then -- then in June when he came in for a 25 Α.

Page 26 haircut, he had said he really wanted to see me at the end 1 of June because his wife was going out of town for a week. 2 But he also wanted to be able to talk to me too 3 during that week because she was going to be gone that 4 whole time. 5 And he bought a burner phone, or like a throwaway 6 I assume he phone or something to use during that week. 7 bought it that week, because I know I only talked to him a 8 few times on it or during that time. 9 You should have his number? 10 0. I'm sure in my phone records it's in there, 11 Α. because I remember the approximate date. 12 When was this? 13 Ο. This would have been end of June. 14 Α. End of June? Q. 15 Because I saw him twice when -- during that week 16 Α. whenever -- it was in the beginning of the week, so let's 17 say if he said, I want to see you -- you know, she's gone 18 Friday to Friday. 19 On Saturday night after I had been out with some 20 girlfriends, I went over to his house. And that night at 21 first he seemed normal, and, you know, talking, whatever. 22 And then we went upstairs into his, like, spare 23 bedroom and were making out. And then he asked me if I had 24 slept with anyone, had I had sex with anyone? 25

2	Because at some point I had. I don't know. And he slapped
